Tech Specs

- Bump In/Out 1-1.5 hours Same Day
- Performance space minimum 3500mm x 3500mm with power, excluding audience space.
- Maximum Audience Size is 40 children plus their adult(s).
- Touring party: 3 performers and 1 stage manager.
- Running Time is 40 minutes.
- We provide floor cushions and rugs for seating.
- Additional seating by venue is required.
- We have our own sound system/speaker. We run sound through QLab (3.5mm aux jack).
- If lighting is available, only warm and blue wash is needed.
- A space that can darken is preferred as the show has shadow puppetry.
- Every child receives an interactive gift box with sensory items to use during the show. They return the box at the end of the performance.
